**Madonna Fund Donation**

In the early 1920s architect Barry Byrne designed the buildings of Immaculata High School in Chicago, and asked his good friend Alfonso Iannelli to sculpt a monumental 11 foot tall Madonna to grace the doorway. It has been learned that most of the actual sculpting was done by noted artist Edgar Miller under Iannelli's direction in Iannelli Studios in Park Ridge.

When the school closed in the early 1980s, the sculpture was removed by the new owners and was thought to be lost. Recently discovered by a group of Immaculata alumnae in storage at the Smart Museum at the University of Chicago, and effort has been mounted to bring this nearly 100 year old sculpture back to the Studio where it was created, where it will have a new permanent home.
